



A coffee table book entitled "Ipoh, My Home Town" was launched by Tun. Dr. Lim Keng Yaik at the Royal Ipoh Club recently, which saw the converging of Ipoh's who's who at the gathering.

Authored by 47 people ranging from the ages of 12 to 90 years old, "Ipoh, My Home Town" contains 64 childhood stories of growing up in Ipoh, penned by a multi-ethnic group of authors from around the world. Edited and compiled by British expatriate, Commander Ian Anderson who has lived in Ipoh since 1999, the 276-page book is an engaging read containing over 400 old photographs, each with its own story captions.

Present also at the launch was Malaysia's favourite cartoonist Dato' Mohammad Nor Khalid, more popularly known as Lat, who wrote the book's foreword and provided his own story and cartoons about growing up in Kampung Sungai Rokam in Ipoh.
